ASK FATHER: 1 QUESTION / 1 ANSWER

Q. In the Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25:14-30), why is the servant who buried his talent condemned when he didn't lose the talent but in fact returned it?

A. The Parable of the Talents was largely about stewardship. Rule #1 in stewardship is "Do what your master wants with his resources."

The steward acknowledged that he knew what he should have done – increase the talent – but chose rather to do what he himself wanted instead – secure the single talent. He had his own motives for this, namely safety and self-preservation. It was safer to bury the talent in the ground because then he wouldn't lose it and at least he could return what was given to him.

To most of us this makes good sense, however, it is not a servant's job to go against his master's wishes – the steward's sole function is to execute his master's will not his own. By burying the talent, the unwise steward disobeyed the Master's increase for his own security. This was an indirect theft of the interest which the Master would have received had the man invested the talent like the other stewards. So the fearful steward was rightly punished for cowardice, self-seeking, disobedience, and theft.

The fact that he buried the talent "in the ground" shows that he considered the earth an appropriate place for investment. Many people often consider earthly investment a "safe" container, delusively promising "security" but in actuality, proving in every case to be untrustworthy, temporary and unable to bring forth lasting fruit of true value. The unwise steward exemplifies the mindset of the worldly, who use the resources the Lord has entrusted to them for His eternal purposes according to their own earthly standards and agendas even when aware that the Master expects something more of them. The Fathers explain that the man should have used the Lord's resources properly by investing them through the Church, which brings forth much increase in the vaults of heaven, "where moth and rust do not destroy nor thieves break in and steal" (Matt 6:20). The parable makes clear that this increase, confidently anticipated by the Master, was not just some potentiality but rather a sure thing in that all the other stewards, the good and faithful ones in the parable, yielded a full and double increase by following the Master's sovereign will.

In the end, most tragically, the true loss was not the increase or lack thereof of the material resources. The loss was about much more, and it was two-fold, including both: 1) the increase of people who could have been joined to the Church had the steward invested the Lord's talent properly, and 2) the steward himself, who out of fear and desire for earthly security, buried with his Master's talent his own soul as well.


